

# **Citace PRO**

**Illustrated login manual**

Citation PRO is an intuitive citation manager. Used to create, manage, export and share citations. The service supports the current version of the ČSN ISO 690 standard.

### **Automatic citation generation**

Enter the book or article title, ISBN or DOI and the system will create a citation for you based on data obtained from verified sources.

### **Citation Management**

After logging in, you can save your citations, edit them, sort them into folders, add your notes, annotations and keywords to them and export them in bulk to MS Word, PDF or TeX.

### **Import citations from databases**

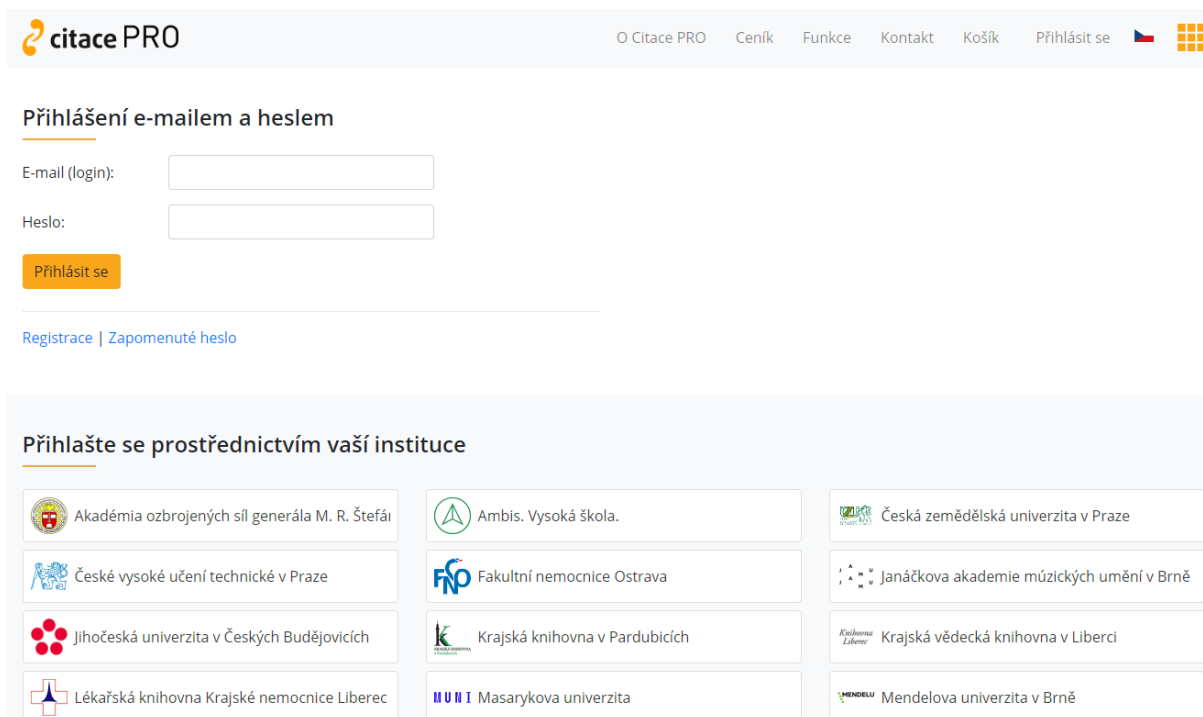
Download citations from databases, catalogs and discovery services with one click or import in bulk using RIS files.

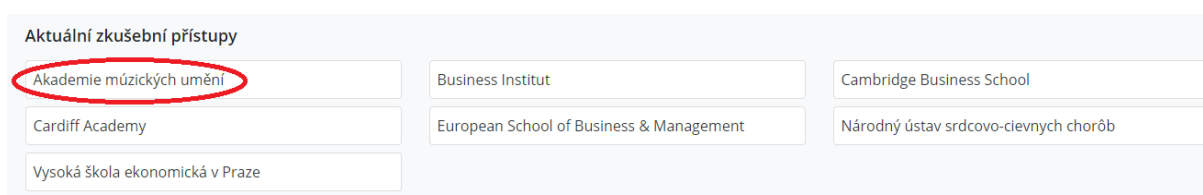
On the initial screen of Citace.com, which works for free, you must first log in to the paid PRO version.
